

Thank you for the opportunity to provide a response to Assessing Fitness to Drive (AFTD).

The suitability of the changes in the updated draft guidelines

ACNP Response – The changes are suitable

Your experience with the current AFTD guidelines and any suggestions you have to make the next version more user-friendly

ACNP Response – While we understand that the previous guidelines did not preclude or prohibit nurse practitioners (NP) from AFTD, we are aware of numerous rejections of NP assessments perhaps only due to the absence of specificity in the guidelines.

We suggest in the new guidelines that nurse practitioners are specifically included as health practitioners that can assess fitness to drive, with a similar approach to the capacity of a general practitioner, as nurse practitioners have assessment and diagnostic capacity in public and private settings, including primary and specialist care, as well as rural and remote areas.

The rejections occurring currently have significantly impacted on some people and their assessments, requiring additional referrals and waiting periods to see alternate practitioners to AFTD.

Any suggestions you have on education or support needed to increase use and knowledge of content in the guidelines

ACNP Response – Engagement with professional colleges and associations to assist with disseminating information, and circulating updated guidelines.
