My submission is regarding <u>electric skateboards</u> - when used responsibly these are a safe and efficient form of transportation.

- Riders should wear a helmet
- Speed should be limited to something safe eg. 25km/h

They are no different from a bicycle, electric bicycle or non-powered boards.

- they are safer and easier to ride because they have an accelerator and brakes
- they are designed for stability/transportation/road use unlike regular skateboards

Benefits:

- They reduce congestion (ie. get cars off our roads)
- They are a much more efficient/cheaper/greener form of transportation and reduce smog in our cities
- They don't take up parking spaces
- They are convenient, can be taken on the train/bus etc
- The provide reasonable exercise
- People enjoy riding them

Bike lanes are ideal, underused and often segregated from cars. There is no reason why electric skateboard riders shouldn't be able to use this existing infrastructure.
